

July Activity Report

This month the regulars were back including Wendy, Ken, Reg, Mike, Cathy, Beryl, Darren and Kate. (Now a regular after her second outing) The activity started in confusion since Jenny was not there and neither was any of the gear we would normally use. It appears that Jenny's contract with Parks has finished and another has yet to be organized. So for a period of time we will be without a ranger until Rob's or/and Jenny's positions are finalized. It appears with the changeover of contacts and with other rangers on leave that there are few rangers currently rostered on in Gippsland.

With the need for more gear, Wendy and Ken went up the shed to get the folding chairs, gloves and digging tools. With these tools and the other tools that others had brought, we then packed the cars and travelled to the work site.

We were fortunate to have another local, Grant come along and help with the activity. Kate had spoken to him about the activity and some after confusion about the meeting place (Kate has a great sense of direction), he arrived later. Grant's help was invaluable.

The task for the day was to try and pull out some of the concrete posts beside the Billy's creek track, so that they can be used as stepping stones for the creek crossings on the Coprosma track. The hope

was the pull a few out, but we did a lot better than planned. The soil was soft beside the creek but a lot harder up on the hill. The posts were very heavy but we managed to remove four before lunch and made a collection of barbed wire which was wrapped around some of the posts.

Lunch was a great BBQ feast arranged by Cathy and Wendy and this was completed by a magnificent cheesecake from Beryl. Mike will go home a very happy man after having some cheesecake for lunch and getting some more for later.

We finished up at around 4pm and by then we had removed seven of the concrete posts. Now comes the challenge of getting them to the creek and using them as stepping stones. Many challenges lie ahead. Another challenge for next month will be dealing with a large tree which has fallen across the Coprosma track just before the second creek crossing. You cannot travel beyond that point in the track and this is also stopping access to the second creek crossing.

August Activity

10.00am Sunday 15th August Junction Road car park

This month the activity will be to continue with the moving of the concrete fence posts. The posts moved in the last activity need to be moved along Coprosma track and put into place at the first creek crossing. These concrete posts will become stepping stones across the creek. Other stones previously placed in the creek have washed away, with the great variation in the creek's flows.

More posts remain up the hill from the information board so these could become further stepping stones. Here there are also the remains of a barbed wire fence with star pickets between the concrete posts, so another job could be the removal of parts of this fence line.

Grant and Reg will handle all of the bigger equipment that the group will need for the activity. Useful equipment others could bring include: shovels, gloves and wire cutters.

Again this month we will have a BBQ lunch. We will be very well looked after. Cathy and Wendy will handle the food for the BBQ and everybody else can bring a plate to accompany the BBQ food. You will need to bring our own drink, plate and eating utensils. A big thank you goes to Wendy and Cathy, who are looking after the workers so well.
