

Hello everyone and welcome to the first newsletter of 2021. We can only hope that 2021 will be better than 2020. The Annual General Meeting for the group was held earlier this month (later than normal because of Covid restrictions). The minutes from the two meetings, including this year's President's Report and the planned program of activities for 2021 are at the end of this newsletter.

#### **December Activity report**

The focus of our December activity was to complete the AGMs which had been delayed by Covid meeting size restrictions. The day started slowly with both Matt and Ken thinking (or deciding between themselves) that the meeting was starting at noon. It gave everybody else an opportunity to catch up and discuss ideas before the meeting started. We started with Mike, Cathy, Jay, Joelle, Beryl, Rose, Tamara, Darren and later Matt and Ken in attendance. We had an apologies from Graeme and Ranger Gabrielle.

Matt and Tamara had completed the Butterfly Orchid survey since the last activity and they reported that there were fewer Butterfly Orchids found in each plot. One plot had no Butterfly Orchids in it since a tree had fallen across the whole plot. There previously were few orchids in this plot and now there are none. This year has been generally good for ground orchids with healthy rains but not so good for the Butterfly Orchids.

The Annual General Meeting and General Meeting were held and the minutes of these meetings are included later in this newsletter. After the meetings we had the Christmas barbeque.

For the BBQ, the group from the meetings were joined by Faye, Wendy, Joan and Chris. Mike and Cathy had done a great job to bring everything we needed, with Mike cooking up a storm on the barbeque. Lunch had a selection of sausages, hamburgers and chicken which people ate with a large selection of salads. Later Beryl's Lemon Cheesecake and a selection of slices were enjoyed.

#### President's Report for 2019-20

Our activity year started well and our schedule was planned out for the year, subject to some deviation at times due to the weather and condition of the walking tracks.

The first half of 2020 has been a strange year one for the Friends Group but we managed to get some monthly activities done, on/off schedule because of Corvid 19 restrictions.

Throughout the year before Covid 19, MNP was visited by Lavalla College doing a biodiversity study. Some students from Lavalla College made a number of nesting boxes for the Friends Group, five of which were put up to replace others that needed repairing. Matt Campbell took a walking group around Billy's Creek Track who were very impressed by the Park.

Federation University visited the Park to study the weed species, located within its boundaries.

Climatewatch did a walk through Foster's Gully with a group to engage in the Climatewatch program and to collect data.

Our nesting box surveys in July and January – showed that there were fewer gliders during the winter months which is the same result as last year. The group noticed that quite of few boxes needed repairs or replacement. In September 2019 new nesting boxes were put up to replace those that were damaged.

In August, the Friends Group tackled Blue Gum Hill with a plan to direct seed the area to determine how effective this technique will be in this area. Yinnar-Yinnar South Landcare (Bronwyn Teesdale) gave a presentation about direct seeding. In December 2019, the Friends Group collected seed from three areas – Billy's Creek, across the road from Junction Road carpark and Blue Gum Hill where the direct seeding was checked – found that there was some success but the thick grass made it hard to assess the overall result.

Track maintenance was a constant for the Friends Group, with plenty of rain and wind, meant that tracks needed frequent attention – some fallen trees were beyond the Friends Group to handle, Parks Victoria would have to clear them. In March the group tackled Muttonwood Track which had become so overgrown with undergrowth and fallen shrubs, that it wasn't visible. After a concerted effort the track was cleared – great job well done!!

The bushfire in March 2019 affected the Muttonwood Creek area which was rehabilitated by Parks Victoria on the whole it was a good job but on closer inspection two patches of Silver Banksias had been flattened by firefighting machinery. I would like to see this species of banksias replanted in the same area.

In November 2019, the group was notified that Morwell National Park had a new Ranger (Gabrielle Browne) and back in May – Craig Campbell retired, I would like to thank him for all his help when he was our Ranger and on other occasions.

Orchid Walk/Koala Count went well, though the orchids showed up later this year but in larger numbers whilst the Koala count had a good result, some spotted by enthusiastic members of the public, especially sharp eyed children.

The Friends Group completed the scheduled activities up to March, when April 2020 came and the Covid 19 restrictions were imposed and our activities were suspended by Parks Victoria. By June there was a relaxation of restrictions ie. Only ten people could attend any activity, the priority was track maintenance, as some of the tracks had become overgrown.
